SHOYU CUCUMBERS RECIPE Camp Kizuna

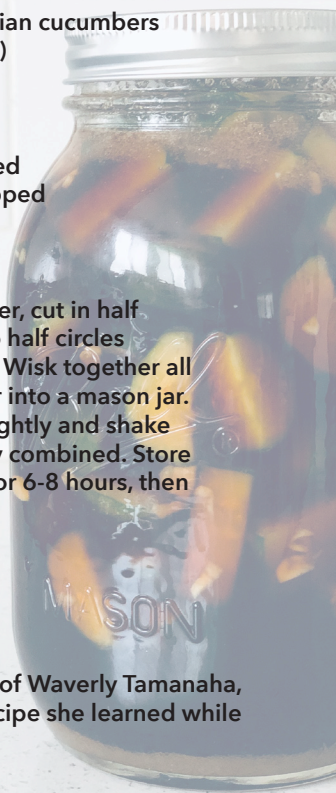
Ingredients

3-4 Japanese or Persian cucumbers
1 C shoyu (soy sauce)
1 C vinegar
2 tsp sesame oil
2/3 C sugar
2 cloves garlic, minced
2 green onions, chopped
Mason Jar

Recipe Instructions

Cut ends off cucumber, cut in half lengthwise, then into half circles about 1/2-inch thick. Wisk together all ingredients and pour into a mason jar. Make sure lid is on tightly and shake ingredients until fully combined. Store in the refridgerator for 6-8 hours, then ENJOY!
